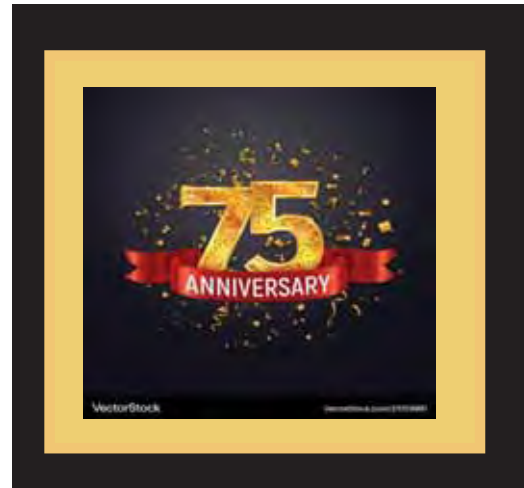

As incoming President of the “SFDFW” (Square and Folk Dance Federation of Washington), I’ve been asked to pen a profile for publication in Footnotes...presumably to give dancers in our state some confidence they will be well-served by the “election results” (quotation marks added because, being honest, having only one name per position on a ballot sheet hardly guarantees the promise of a positive outcome on behalf of the voters). That being said, allow me to offer this autobiographical sketch.

My wife Gail and I began square dancing in California shortly after we got married in 1969. Like a lot of other post-WWII adults, both sets of our parents square danced during the “hay-days” of the 1960’s. But “life” events (finishing school, starting a family...two boys, job and geographical relocations, etc.) made being consistent square dancers a challenge. It wasn’t until we were approaching empty “nester-hood” (late 80’s) that we became fully-vested in the activity and have, for the most part, remained so ever since.

Lane was a manufacturing/operations manager for most of his career and finished as an executive recruiter. Gail was a customer support representative and manager for the bulk of her career. We both retired in about 2014.

We’ve lived in the South Puget Sound area since moving to WA in 2003. We are proud and happy grandparents...one girl (2004), one boy (2006).

Back to square dancing. Over the years we have held board positions (president, vice president, secretary, treasurer), as well as various committee appointments, for more than half of the dozen square dance organizations in which we’ve been members. Including the SFDFW in the mix, 6 of these were as President (for multiple terms in office on several occasions).

On the “bragging” side of the square dance ledger, primary responsibility for the “Mob Squad” flashmob performance during the 2016 WA State Fair (75 squares), the success of the Swingnuts’ “Thursday-Nite Lites” program over the past 10 years, recently founding the Clam Diggers Square Dance Club (Ocean Shores,

WA), recently beginning the journey (precipitated by the passing of Don Wood) to become a square dance caller, ongoing “drum-beating” promotion of the WheresTheDance.com website to the point of it being a “standard” promotion tool for nearly half the clubs in the state, developing a companion website to the state federation website (the “WApics” picture site) to archive photos and videos taken at dances throughout the state, being the first square dance club in the state to establish a “Twitter” account, being the first in the state to implement the use of QR codes on flyers (now commonplace), and being the author of “DYK” (Did You Know...?) articles for Footnotes are gratifying and satisfying accomplishments.

Since the pandemic there are some encouraging signs that square dancing may be poised for a period of rebirth and growth. With the help of others in leadership roles with the Federation, the Councils, and among the roughly 80 clubs in our state, the future of square dancing in WA looks brighter today than in 2020 (fingers crossed). I/we, along with the remainder of the Federation’s board and committee chairs (some as yet to be named) look forward to serving you well. There’s much to do, and we hope you’ll participate.

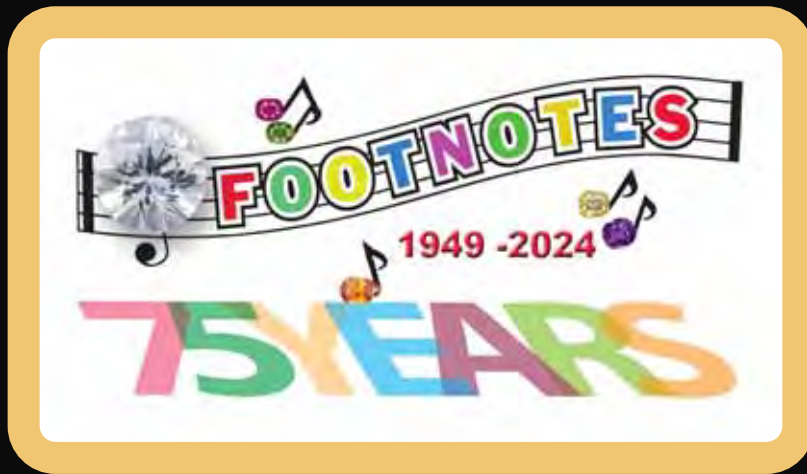

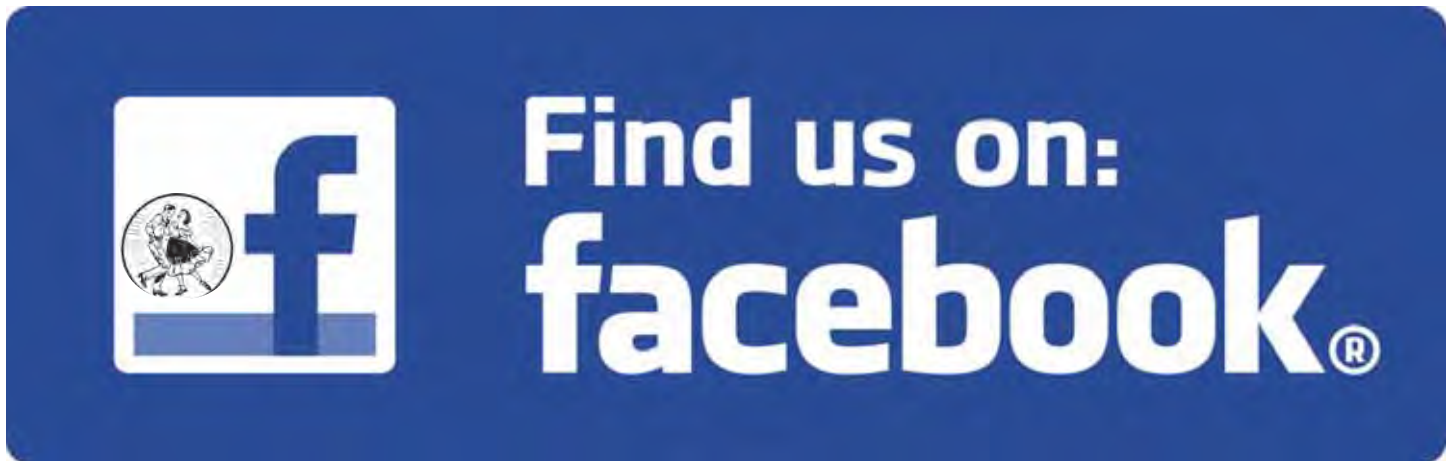

A new graduate joining your club would be handled the same as any person joining the club, send us their name, address, and telephone number. A club may add new members during the dance year by simply sending us the new person's name, address and their telephone number.

CALLER TO CALLER

I would like to thank Cynda (Footnotes Editor) for asking me to write the monthly caller's article for the 2024 and 2025 year. This is the 75th year for the Footnotes magazine. That's a milestone that has involved many square dancers over the 75 year period. It's an honor and I look forward to the challenge. I've decided to call the articles I write CALLER to CALLER. Yes, if you are not a caller, please read my articles because we can work together.

We had a great time at the State Festival in Yakima in July. The Rainer Council did a super job on hosting the event. Next July, 2025, the State Festival will again be in Yakima hosted by the Central Council.

A little bit about us, Bob and Claudia Amsbury. We just celebrated our 60th anniversary on August 22nd. We took square dance lessons in 1968 on Wednesday evenings. I didn't want to go, but my twin brother said please try it. So we went the last night of open class and we didn't have to pay. I told everybody I'm going for one night only. After week one I had cowboy boots, cowboy shirt, a bolo, and a towel holder on my belt. We had nine squares (yes nine) of new students in our class. We had a club name, and officers made up of all the new students

There were only 50 basic calls at that time; this was before CALLERLAB was formed. We did have a few party level dances during our lessons. At the end of lessons we were asked to join Hix & Chix. Yes, at that time you had to be invited to join a club. (How times have changed.) As some of you remember, we danced from 8:00pm to Midnight, and rounds were not cued until many years later in the Spokane area.

We learned to round dance at about the same time as squares. After a couple of years, I started to teach rounds and cue at our weekly round dance workshop. We had a very large group of round dancers every Wednesday night. After about two years of cueing I started to call square dancing. Jim West was my caller coach. I went to his dances and classes for a couple years to start learning how to call. My first caller clinic was with Wade Driver

and Bill Davis the week before the 1981 Square Dance National in Seattle Washington. Before that in 1979 Diamond Squares asked me to be their club caller; that was 45 years ago, and I'm still calling for them. I called, cued, and taught rounds and squares (after clubs started cueing at open dances) for Diamond squares and then in 1986 Claudia started cueing.

We also called and taught square dancing, mixers, and line dances for the Dixie Chain Gang, a teen club, for 13 years in Spokane sponsored by the Spokane City and Parks Department. We danced every Saturday morning at the Western Dance Center in the Spokane Valley September thru March. That was before soccer, skiing, and other sports were offered to young people.

We have been involved in club, Spokane Area Council, State Federation and the National here in Washington. We have held offices at many levels; chaired many square dance activities to include State festivals. Claudia has been Secretary for Spokane Callers and Cuers for many years. We have supported the Leadership Seminar almost from day one.

In 2012, we were in charge of Housing for the National. After I presented my ideas to the NEC for online housing, the NEC approved that request. Spokane was the first National that supported on line housing registration for the National Convention. All I can remember is how so many dancers want handicap rooms. We did run out of handicap rooms.

We attended the Penticton Festival for over 40 years. We, both, were on the program during that time serving as MC for evening dancing several different times. We miss that Penticton dance and seeing all our Canadian friends.

We have hosted two square dance cruises to the Caribbean- one with Don and Judy Cochrane and the 2nd with Brian and Lorraine Murdoch. Both were great fun with a large number of dancers.

We were honored to receive the Parker award in 1988, the McNutt award for rounds in 2011, and the President's award in 1997 for our overall support for this activity we love. In 1981 were recipients of Spokane Area Council's Hall of Fame award for our involvement with all aspects of square dancing. I joined CALLERLAB in 1992 and have attended about ten conventions over the years.

In 2022 I received my Half Century Certificate from CALLERLAB for 50 years of calling. Next year in March CALLERLAB will be celebrating its 50th convention. Claudia began cueing in 1986, and she cues and we continue to teach rounds currently. We are members of Roundalab since 2000. Beside the local clubs we call and cue around Washington, Idaho and Montana.

We have two children, Julie and Eric, both took square dance lessons with Dixie Chain Gang. Julie still dances on occasion today and Eric is busy with work and family. We have five grandchildren all grown up. We are truly enjoying our three Great Granddaughters. We are fortunate as they all live in the Spokane Area.

I love calling, however my passion is teaching. I have worked very hard to be the best teacher I can be. My next two articles will be about teaching. Writing this article is complete out of my comfort zone, so be & please be patience with me. Please remember that my articles are MY OPINION, period. The Sewing Bird

This simple, helpful tool was found in every home when more people sewed. The bird works as a third hand while stitching. The gold one is a valuable antique. Lift the tail to open the mouth. Many were very ornate, with pincushions and scissors holders. The silver one has a scissors clamp. The harder you pull, the more it clamps down. It can be found in sewing stores and online.



A third-hand makes life easier. I use a sewing clamp from the 1930s to hold one side of the project while ripping a seam or working with cords. It's duller than the antiques but holds the fabric tight. The smooth grip does not harm the fabric.



Make one very quickly and inexpensively.

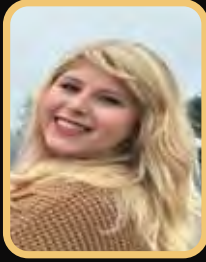
Materials - a 3-inch C-clamp, 3-inch bulldog paper clip, thick rubber band, or strong cord.

Loop the rubber band or cord through one of the bulldog clip handles. (If put through both, it will pull the handles together.) Then, tie it to the handle of the C-clamp.

Optional - Glue circles of rubbery shelf liner to the ends of the clamp to protect your table.

You will have a new tool that is easily moved and doesn't take up much room. Once you have used it a few times, it will become a new favorite.

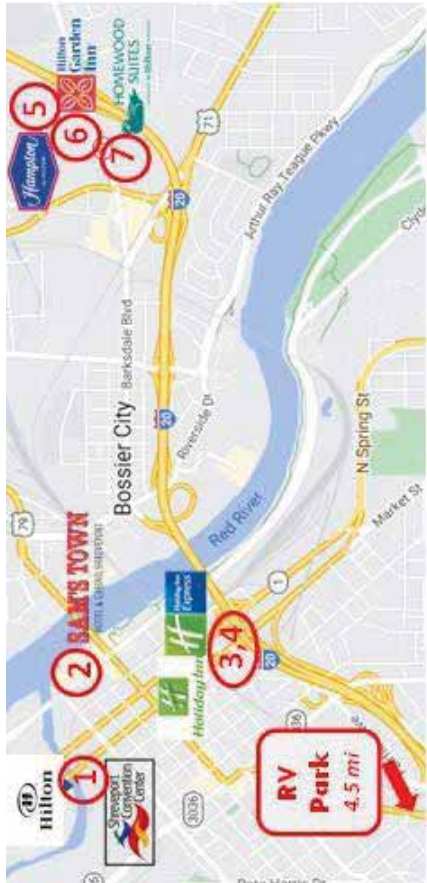

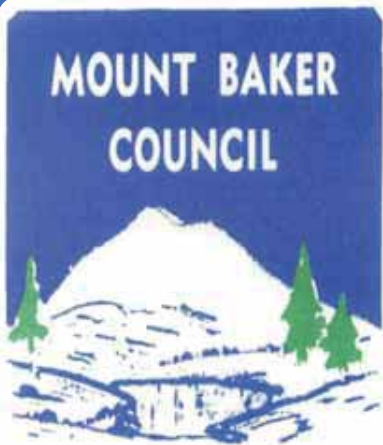

Happy October! Color, re-vitalizing brisk winds, and thinking about which Halloween costumes to wear!

As we get our new season & lessons underway again, I thought I'd share a few thoughts:

1) Angels on the lesson floor are a beautiful thing. Everyone learns a bit differently, so a gentle reminder that patience, with a smile or encouraging nods or "You'll get it" vocal encouragement goes a LONG way in showing acceptance, and thus reduces stress and aids opening of their ability to take in and learn from the caller. And as all angels prove just by being there, these calls CAN be learned - with lots of patience and repetition!☑

2) Your club (& Council) organizations could probably also use your specific talents off the floor. Ask, look around and offer to see what might need to be done. One idea that came to my mind recently is - for someone with "an organizational mindset and administrative skills" including comfort with emailing: Council is looking for someone to help coordinate future demonstration "demo" dances. Main skills - willingness to be a contact person; communicate (usually by email) with the location sponsoring the event to gather details; communicate (again by email) to our list of Callers to see who might be interested and available; confirm date & time & any equipment needed, and if any tickets are involved; communicate to our RC dancer community about the specific details of a specific "demo" (email to clubs, Facebook admin, perhaps an advance mention to Footnotes RC Area Reporter, and, optionally, live announcements at dances). Additionally, willingness to learn and work with sign-ups (software or in-person sheets) for those few demos that might involve a required free entrance ticket. We have folks with plenty of experience and willingness to share their knowledge... (Good time for a special thank-you shout-out for years of service to Lane & Gail!) We just need person(s) willing to keep track of the steps and keep the community informed about each potential demo. Could that be you?

3) On a similar note: Publicity - Submitting potential ads/articles to Coffee News and other news organs. Again we have experienced folks willing to share their knowledge. Council (and maybe some clubs) just need someone to actually do the steps and keep track as needed.

Give it a thought. It is a good feeling to be contributing to the success of our fun friendship activity.

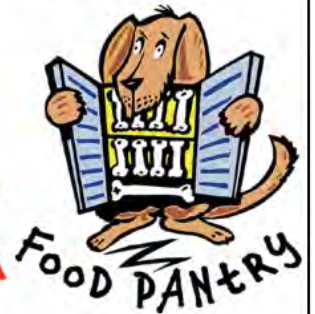

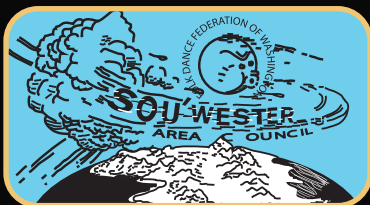
